- House must be received on a flat base that is between 1/4" 3/4" thick (preferably plywood). The bases will be discarded along with the house should it not be picked up by the deadline.
- The base should be painted, decorated to create a complementary scene, or covered with foil
- The base for your house should be between 10"x 10" to 15"x 24"
- Drop Off and Pick Up is at the entrance at 11030 East Blvd. between 8am-noon on the designated dates only
- Houses not picked up by noon on their designated Pick Up date will be discarded
- When dropping off your house, the Entry Form must be included

#### HOW TO MAKE A GINGERBREAD HOUSE

Gingerbread houses are a tradition that you can continue ever year with your loved ones. Building a gingerbread house takes patience and time. The icing is like the glue that makes a gingerbread house sturdy, since it is what binds everything together. The icing takes hours to dry so completing a house can take up to two days. Make sure to have decorative items on hand such as colorful candy, different colored frosting and fun cookie cutter shapes to go along with your house.

## **STEP 1: PICK YOUR HOUSE STYLE**

There are many free patterns online, so search and find one that you like! An important aspect of a good house is a strong, sturdy base—and the best way to do that is with a balanced structure. You need to ensure that the walls can support the roof.

## **STEP 2: CUT OUT HOUSE SHAPES**

Create your patterns and cut them out of cardboard.

# **STEP 3: MAKE THE DOUGH**

You don't want to use dough that is too soft or crumbly, otherwise, the house wouldn't be able to support itself. Leaveners aren't necessary as you don't want the dough to puff up and distort the shapes once cut. Roll the dough and cut each shape out of dough using the patterns and bake as directed.

## **STEP 4: MAKE THE ROYAL ICING**

While the cookies are cooling, prepare the Royal Icing. Immediately transfer icing to a pastry bag fitted with



a pastry tip. Cover any excess icing with a damp paper cloth, and if necessary, beat the icing on high to restore its texture before adding to the piping bag.

## **STEP 5: ASSEMBLE THE BASE**

To assemble the gingerbread house, pipe the icing along the base and edges of the front wall and one side wall. Position the pieces at a 90° angle and place on the plywood base. Prop up the pieces with small jars or cans. Repeat the process with the back wall and a second side. Let icing dry for at least 30 minutes. The exact time will depend on how thick the icing is applied, but it should be dry to the touch.

#### **STEP 6: ATTACH THE ROOF**

To attach the roof, pipe icing along the peaked edges of the front and back walls. Position roof pieces into place and let fully dry before decorating.

#### **STEP 7: DECORATE**

Now that your house is assembled, it's time to decorate. The way you decorate your house is entirely up to you, but some traditional ways include candy canes, gumdrops, cookie wafers and frosting.
