This is an exciting opportunity to work directly with children, ages 6-13, leading fun and educational activities in their neighborhoods while maintaining vibrant community gardens. If you have a passion for plants, outdoor education, and working with kids in their own neighborhoods, this is the perfect role for you!

Position Details:

- Contract Position
- Approximately 30-40 hours, flexible weekly schedule
- Mandatory paid training provided May 28 May 31
- Position runs from June to November, with potential opportunities to assist with additional programming starting in April, depending on scheduling and availability
- Typical work schedule from 12:00 p.m. 6:00 p.m.
- \$16/hour
- Opportunity to work at community center sites across Cleveland
- Reports to Community Engagement Education Coordinator
- Excellent opportunity for individuals seeking employment in a nature-related field to acquire experience in educating young people within an outdoor environment

Key Responsibilities:

- Support Holden Forests & Gardens' mission, vision, and values through leading hands-on gardening and community-building activities
- Attend paid training sessions to become familiar with responsibilities, procedures, safety standards, and project sites
- Regularly maintain and tend to community engagement gardens, including weeding, watering, cleaning, fertilizing, pruning, transplanting, and inspecting plants
- Collaborate with neighborhood site staff to develop and implement community-building projects that activate and improve gardens for youth participants
- Assist teammates with excursions, crafts, games, and skill-building workshops as needed
- Safely utilize and handle plants, program supplies, and tools
- Safely transport plants, program supplies, and tools using your own vehicle
- Abide by weekly check-ins with supervisor to ensure project goals and priorities are met
- Perform other relevant duties as assigned

Qualifications and Skills:

- Minimum of 18 years of age
- High school diploma or equivalent required
- Pursuing or completion of an an undergraduate degree in, Education, Environmental Science, Horticulture, Agriculture, or related field, a plus
- Some gardening experience is required
- One (1) year of experience guiding youth in education setting, a plus
- Clear communication and approachable customer service skills
- Ability to follow instructions, learn activities, and deliver lesson plans
- Valid drivers' license and acceptable driving record required
- Applicants must have their own reliable transportation
- Applicant must be patient, hardworking, flexible, and able to work under pressure
- Applicant must proficiently use or learn Google Workplace tools
- Must pass a criminal background check

Physical Requirements

Must be able to perform with or without reasonable accommodation:

- Ability to lift 50 lbs. and work with garden tools outdoors in varying weather conditions
- Sitting, standing, kneeling, and sometimes hiking on uneven surfaces
- Ability to adapt to dynamic outdoor situations
- Ability to occasionally set up and tear down folding tables, chairs, and pop-up tents
